With additional funding carried over from last year and limited opportunities for level 2 and 3 competitions, it was decided to focus on extending the sport opportunities within the school. Due to COVID not all competitions took place face to face but instead virtually. We held numerous intra-school competitions such as sportshall athletics, football, golf, clap and catch etc Canterbury Academy provided coaching sessions in Tchoukball, cheerleading, Staff gymnastics CPD session was given on gymnastic teaching to teachers in the school as this was a section of the P.E. curriculum that could not be taught under Covid restrictions and it was an area after a staff audit that needed some support. It is important that skills and safety priorities are refreshed regularly to enable us to continue to provide high-quality PE sessions for all.

Sports Equipment	£7656	Provide equipment to support high quality PE lessons, extra curricular activities. - Supply equipment for each COVID class bubble - New PE shed/base for storage of new equipment	All staff and children to have access to appropriate, high quality PE equipment to deliver outstanding PE lessons. Resources were bought to enable a range of activities to take place such as dodgeballs, hockey sticks, lacrosse nets, Class R bikes. Individual class equipment boxes were created and supplied due to COVID regulations. Extra resources such as re-bouncers were bought to develop skills that did not need contact. New sports could be introduced to the children to try and therefore engage them further in PE. Replacement equipment supports the teaching of high quality PE lessons. The monitoring of the PE equipment was down to PE. During lockdown key worker bubbles had access to their own sports equipment. <i>These resources enabled us to offer a range of PE sessions to all pupils while keeping to government guidelines about cross contamination and cleaning of equipment. Many of the resources will remain next year and can be used to enhance PE teaching.</i>

In order to encourage all-round fitness and enjoyment of sport we sourced, purchased and installed outdoor gym equipment on the field for all children to use both at breaktimes, lunchtimes and during PE lessons. With the aim to increase the time they are active and work towards achieving the government Active 30 challenge.
Whole School Personal Best Challenge - Brownlee Brothers - medals	£300	To improve the mentality and physicality of the children.	After returning from lockdown in T4, we wanted to ignite the children's interest in sport and being active. A challenge was set to try new sport each week for T6 or to try and beat their personal best in a particular sport. This captured their attention and increased the fitness levels of the school. All children received a medal on completion of the challenge. Many children tried sports which they enjoyed and have wanted to carry on.
Unfortunately, there was no opportunity for swimming lessons this year. This will have an impact on the PE curriculum over the next 2 years where pupils need to complete their basic swimming lessons and we need to			

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	provide catch-up lessons to Year 6. Data was collected as to how many pupils in Year 6 had achieved the Swimming objectives even though we could not support these pupils further.
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The School received £17 960 in School Sport Premium money for the financial year 2020- 21 with an additional £8473 carried over from 2020 when the school was in lockdown at the end of the year. Our Sport action plan was written this year with the expectation of a return to normal teaching. With the second lockdown in January to March and social distancing in place throughout the year, the priorities of the plan have had to adapt and change throughout the year.
