Here at Sheldwich, we have made it our aim and focus to ensure that all children are active and healthy. We pride ourselves on the prominence and emphasis placed on a healthy and active lifestyle. Having been awarded the Platinum Sport Kitemark Award, we have continued to have a high level

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of commitment to sport in our school. Furthermore, we aim to increase the opportunity for all pupils to participate in sport. This could be through competitive sport such as inter or intra sport competitions. Plus, access to various other sports that we run to engage all our pupils in sport.

This year has seen an unprecedented changes to all our plans and lives. Many of our plans had to change from March 2020 with the National lockdown and closure of schools due to Covid 19 and therefore many of our targets were not completed. We adapted and changed our plans and tried to develop sport within the school and during remote learning whilst following government guidance.

The following is a review of the targets for the year that were in place up to March 2020. Our targets will resume again once the curriculum can return to full sport and PE teaching.

We started the year off by training our Sports Crew who were encouraged to come back to school and promote a healthy and active lifestyle. We competed in interschool competitions in Tag Rugby, Dodgeball, Basketball, Handball, Sportshall Athletics, Cross Country, Hockey, Swimming, Football and Volleyball before competitions were suspended due to Covid19.

Even though we were still in lockdown, we did finish the year off with success at the Canterbury Partnership Annual Sports awards. We were awarded the Sports partnership award for 'Contribution to Active 30 Award', our Yr 5/6 Hockey Team won KS2 Team of the Year. A few individuals were also successful, Serena for the 'Most Competitive Appearances 2019/2020', Thiago was 'KS2 Sports Personality of the Year 2019-20' and Luca (Yr 6) won the Sportsmanship Award 2019-20.

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We also received an award for recognition of our ongoing commitment and achievement to the School Games Programme for the Autumn and Spring terms.

Alongside our two hours of PE a week per class, we continued to offer an array of sports clubs that run afterschool which have engaged an increasing number throughout the year. Within these clubs there was an increase in participation by our least active. The feedback from these clubs has been really positive and many children have gone on to take up these sports at local clubs outside of school.

We have also used some of our Sports Premium money to subscribe to the i-moves dance website which has enabled all the children to access not only dance led activities but daily workouts which we have participated in. Moreover, our Year 6 class completed their bikeability during the year and as a result we as a school encourage our pupils to cycle or walk to school if at all possible, Throughout the year we have utilised a variety of sports coaches to come in and pair teach with our staff. This has engaged pupils throughout the first part of the year and meant that many now take it up outside of school. As part of the allocation of the sport funding money, we have paid an annual subscription to our local School Sport Partnership - this clearly has sustainability benefits and the children have benefitted from the vast amount of competitions that we are able to access (both inter and intra), specialised coaching, sports leadership support and teacher training as well as subject leader support.

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Furthermore, at Sheldwich we encourage as many children as possible in the organising and running of our competitive events. Firstly, we have Sports Crew of Year 6 pupils who undertook training at the beginning of the academic year by our School Games Officer, in how to run competitions within the school. Following this training, they have organised and delivered a whole school termly virtual league. This has entailed, the children demonstrating the sports (golf, football, athletics, gymnastics, rugby and netball) recording the results, inputting and analysing the results and then presenting certificates in assembly to the winning children. I have personally held meetings with the Year 6 Sports Leaders and discussed what clubs they would like to have, what sports we should try and what competitions/challenges they would like to run at lunch times or in our Sports Week. Throughout all year groups in the school, we have run and held interhouse competitions in a variety of sports. Children in each class have then helped run and organise these events either, refereeing, coaching or recording results of these. All of what we do at Sheldwich is documented either on our in school sports noticeboard, school newsletter or on the school website. This includes match reports from Inter School competitions written by the children.

During Term 6 pupils were guided towards the Kent Active Rainbow which develops all sides of health and fitness.

During lockdown the emphasis for PE changed to personal challenge and individual sports.
